Grand River Technical School signed and returned the certification and agreement form on 09/23/2020. Our institution is using the funds to provide the mandated amount of at least 50% of the Higher Education Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students.

The Grand River Technical School received \$56,779.50 in emergency grant funds for the student portion.

3. Of those funds, the total amount that has been distributed to students as of the date of reporting

The total amount of grant funds distributed to eligible students:

\$38,581.00 has been distributed as of 10/30/2020.

4. The estimated total number of students at the institution eligible to participate in programs under Section 484 in Title IV of the Higher Education Act of 1965 and therefore eligible to receive an emergency financial aid grant.

Seventy-five (75) of Seventy-five (75) students are eligible and received funds.

5. The total number of students who have received an emergency financial aid grant.

51 students have received grant money as of 10/30/20.

6. How the institution determined which students did, or will receive emergency financial aid grants and how much funding they did, or will receive.

All students are required to complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FASFA). Due to the pandemic, the students' program of study was disrupted; making it necessary to transition to Distance Learning. All students received equal amounts of assistance. Students signed an Acceptance of Emergency Financial Aid form, certifying they will use the funds for expenses related to the disruption of campus operations and areas associated with Cost of Attendance.

7. Any instructions, directions, or guidance provided by the institution to students concerning the emergency financial aid grants.

Students have been sent information via school email and by an informational letter mailed to their listed home address notifying them that the funds are available to assist them with costs incurred due to the pandemic.
