FOR GRADUATING SENIORS:

GRTS Director's Scholarship- Scholarships of up to \$1000 to high school seniors enrolling at GRTS. Selection based on citizenship and career goals with a minor emphasis on financial need. **Application deadline to GRTS – April 15.** *Application available at GRTS.*

Allen Moore Memorial Scholarship- This scholarship was established in 2019 by the family of Mr. Moore to recognize students pursuing a career in Technical Education, and who display desire to better their life and community. *Application available at GRTS.*

Duckworth Technology Scholarship- GRTS will award up to \$1000 to exemplary senior graduating from Grand River Technical School Computer Service Technology program and continuing their education at GRTS in the Computer/Networking program or Automation & Electrical Technology. **Application due April 15th.** *Application available at GRTS.*

North Missouri Sportsman's Alliance Scholarship- This \$500 scholarship was established in 2019, in recognition of a student who displays a strong desire to further their education in a skilled trade through career and technical education. **Applications due April 15th.** *Application available at GRTS.*

Kenneth & Eugenia Churchill Scholarship- Scholarships totaling up to \$8000 awarded to graduating high school senior(s) completing a high school program at GRTS and continuing their post-secondary training at GRTS. **Application due April 1st** of each year. *Application available at GRTS.*

POST-HIGH SPRING SCHOLARSHIPS:

Vern R. Glick William (Matt) McCarthy Memorial Scholarship- \$500 scholarship awarded to a student in a full-time program. Priority given to student who is a veteran or the descendent of a veteran and enrolled in an automotive related program.

Chillicothe Rotary Scholarship- Two scholarships in the amount of \$750 each awarded to exemplary GRTS post-secondary student who represents GRTS in the business community. Must maintain at least a 95% attendance and a "B" grade average. Scholarship is awarded in the second semester based on first semester performance.

Robert & Helen Smith Memorial Scholarship- Numerous scholarships up to \$500 for post-secondary students who maintain at least a "B" average and 95% attendance in first semester.

Chris Frakes Memorial Scholarship- \$500 scholarship awarded to one exemplary Paramedic student. This scholarship in memory of Chris Frakes, former GRTS Paramedic student killed in the line of duty as a flight medic.

Livingston County First Responders Scholarship- One or more scholarships from \$1000 - \$5000 awarded to EMT, Paramedic or Firefighter students who wish to serve as first responders including EMT, Paramedic and Firefighter, for an agency located within Livingston County, MO. Applicant must commit to first 3 years of service after graduation to Livingston County, MO agency. Missouri Returning Heroes Scholarship- \$1000 non-restricted scholarship awarded to qualifying combat veterans who have served in armed combat in a qualifying combat zone since September 11, 2001. See GRTS financial aid office for qualifications. Must submit copy of DD-214 to receive scholarship. This scholarship may be used for "other educational expenses" such as but not limited to tools, transportation or other living expenses.
